



Camp Create for 6-12 year olds

Each session meets Monday - Friday from 9am - 4pm

Session #1 June 14 – 18 All Aboard for the Orient Express

Spend this week on an exciting journey discovering Asian culture and art. Kites, kimonos, kabuki, gyutako (fish rubbings) and origami, are just a few of the art forms that will inspire our travelers as they have the opportunity to create their own Asian themed drawings, paintings, sculptures and mixed media artworks.

Session #2 June 21 – 25 Circus! Circus!

Calling all tightrope walkers, lion tamers, acrobats, aerialists and clowns! Join us for an action packed week under the Big Top at Camp Create. Our daring performers will use their imaginations to create circus-themed art projects using a variety of media such as paint, clay and wire. Campers will be introduced to and learn about the elements of art using concepts of shape, color, texture and form in their creations.

Session #3 June 28 – July 2 Art-tastic Masters

Would you like to learn how to create your own masterpieces both large and small with inspiration from some of the world’s best known master artists? During this week, campers will learn about the lives, history and techniques of artists such as Monet, Vincent van Gogh, Matisse, Picasso, Frida Kahlo, Georgia O’Keefe, Andy Warhol and more. A variety of media will be used by our own artists to make their masterpieces.

Session #4 July 12 – 16 Wandering through Wonderland

Jump down the rabbit hole and join us on a wild trip through the looking glass for some wacky fun in Wonderland. Our campers will use a variety of art media to create Wonderland-inspired artworks based on the Lewis Carroll story. Who knows, there might even be a special invitation to a “Very Merry Un-Birthday” and Mad Hatter’s Tea!

Session #5 July 19 – 23 Mythology, Magic, Folklore and Fun

Are you ready for a magical trip into the realm of imaginary gods, heroes, beasts and fantastic characters that make up the stories of myth and folktales? Zeus, Medusa, unicorns, dragons, wizards, ogres, fairies and more are waiting just for you. Campers will explore a variety of media to create their original mythic, magical art.

Session #6 July 26 – 30 Where the Wild Things Are

Have you ever imagined sailing on a sea and traveling through a strange and mysterious forest in search of fearsome-looking monsters? Then this is the adventure for you! Inspired by the writing and illustrations of Maurice Sendak, our imaginers will spend the week creating their own “wild things” using a variety art media.
